

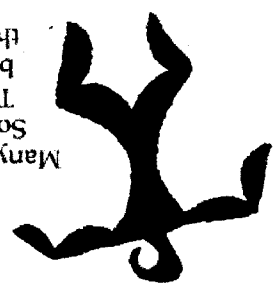

Na K'i Kala! (Carved Figures)

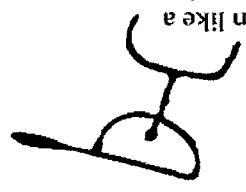

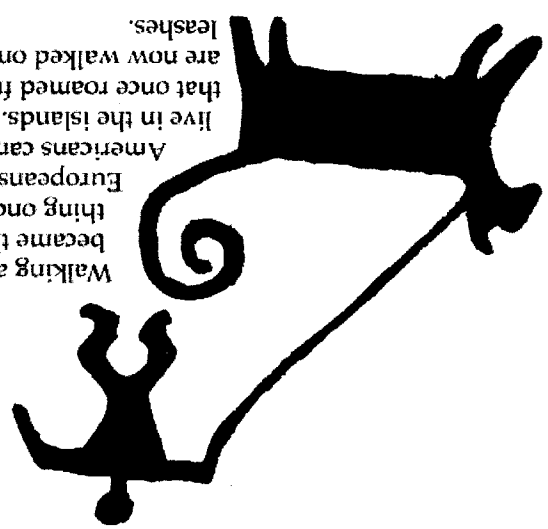
Many petroglyphs, or rock carvings, are human forms. Some are plain, stick figures while others have muscles. This one has a head with what appears to be a bird's beak. It is thought to represent a bird man. What was the reason for this figure? We don't know for sure.



This is a human form drawn like a stick figure. It has a paddle or hoe raised above his head. He is thought to be doing a canoe paddle dance.



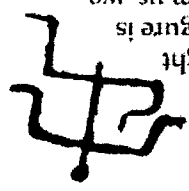
Walking a dog became the "in" thing once Europeans and Americans came to live in the islands. Dogs that once roamed freely are now walked on leashes.



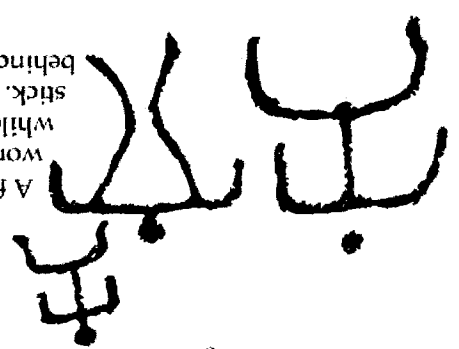
This is a dog. The upper part of the dog's head is its ears. Since the dog's mouth is closed, this dog is not barking.



This is a stick figure that is running. Notice that his right leg is in the air. Since the figure is facing us and not away from us, we know that he is running towards us.



A family portrait! A woman's figure is open while a man's figure is a stick. The young child behind them is probably a boy.



Come fishing? This fisherman has cast out a single line with a hook and has caught a very large fish.
